Two Policy and Campaigns Officers presented a paper on education and the need to set out a broader vision for a rights-based and anti-oppressive approach to primary and secondary education. The paper set out the overarching principles that should guide Liberty's approach to working on education - either through influencing legislation, intervening in legal cases or speaking about education in public comms.

These principles were:

- 1. Liberty should take a holistic view of the right to education
- 2. Education is inherently political
- 3. Education should value care and trust over surveillance, punishment and control
- 4. Education should centre young people's voice and promote their dignity and self-determination
- 5. Inclusive education must be underpinned by the social model of disability

It was noted that the above principles were non-exhaustive, and that human rights frameworks should be seen as the floor and not the ceiling. These principles were accepted and endorsed by Policy Council.
